BEWARE OF RATTLESNAKES

WATER SAVINGS TIPS



TAKE 5 MINUTE SHOWERS:

Educate all family members to do so. saves 5-10 gallons a day per person



PURCHASE A LOW-FLOW

SHOWER-HEAD: Uses 1-2 gallons of water per minute. saves 15 gallons per shower



TURN OFF THE FAUCET WHILE BRUSHING YOUR TEETH OR

SHAVING:

saves 5-10 gallons per day



FIX ALL FAUCET LEAKS:

saves 5-10 gallons per day



CHECK YOUR TOILET FOR LEAKS:

Put in a few drops of food coloring into the tank, wait thirty minutes. If the food coloring seeps into the bowl you have leak.

saves 30-500 gallons per day



WASH ONLY FULL LOADS IN

THE WASHING MACHINE:

Reduce your laundry load by one load per week.
saves 30 gallons per load

WASH ONLY FULL LOADS IN



THE DISH WASHER:

Reduce your laundry load by one load per week.

saves 30 gallons per load

CAPTURE THE TAP WATER:



While you wait for the water to get hot in the shower or sink, catch the flow in a bucket or bowl. Use this water on your house plants or in your garden. saves 200-300 gallons each month

AVOID TAKING BATHS:



If you must, fill your bathtub only halfway: a full bath tub uses 36 gallons of water. saves 18 gallons per person

RUN THE DISHWASHER INSTEAD OF WASHING BY HAND:



It uses let hot water

saves 15 gallons per load

Your bank may take money out of your account today, but not write a check for up to 10 days after your request.

We may not get your payment for up to 14 days after your request.

There is a minimum processing charge for the online credit card payments, but the payments are processed immediately.

Renters: All renters can ONLY use Quick Pay. Please DO NOT register account, this belongs to the owner, and will change their information on the account.

AUTO PAY and PHONE PAYMENTS are also available.

Auto Pay is available to all owner registered accounts. Once your information has been verified and your bill is paid in full, you can set up auto pay to pay your bill in full on the due date. The due dates are the 20th day of every odd month. To use the Phone Payment System call 661-825-1515. Have your full account number, amount due and credit card available.

We accept Visa, MasterCard, AMEX and Discover. (Online Transaction fee is added and will be displayed before you submit your payment).

The CSD office will only receive cash or check.
