CHAPTER 1

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION:

- 6-1-1: Uses Allowed
6-1-2: Limitations On Use
6-1-3: Golf Ball Concessions

6-1-1: **USES ALLOWED:** The Stallion Springs Lake shall be used for fishing in nonrestricted areas and for the enhancement of the scenic beauty of the area. All California angling regulations will apply regarding baits, lures, limits and sizes for the species of fish that inhabit the lake. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988)

6-1-2: **LIMITATIONS ON USE:** Notwithstanding the provisions of section 6-1-1 of this chapter, and with the exception of approved district maintenance work, the following described activities are expressly prohibited in, on or about Stallion Springs Lake:

- A. Swimming, wading, diving, snorkeling, scindiving, floating, boating or ice skating;
- B. Fishing without a permit issued by the district;
- C. Fishing in restricted areas;
- D. Operating a motor vehicle of any type, riding horses off equestrian easements or grazing or watering cattle or similar animals;
- E. Depositing, discarding, throwing or otherwise placing or causing to be placed glass, nails, metal, refuse, debris or leaving any dead animal or putrefying matter in, on or about the lake which shall in any way conflict with any law, ordinance, rule or regulation affecting the use of the lake;

- F. Placing, posting, gluing, tacking or otherwise posting any sign, placard, advertisement or inscription whatsoever in, on or about the lake without written permission of the district or its authorized representative. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988; Ord. 123, 12-18-2001)

6-1-3: GOLF BALL CONCESSIONS: Upon approval by the board of directors and receipt of the fee set forth herein, the general manager shall issue an annual permit allowing the permittee to remove golf balls from the Stallion Springs Lake. Said permittee shall present proof of permittee's ability to hold the district, its officers, agents and employees harmless, indemnify and defend them from any and all liability or claims arising as a result of permittee's removal of golf balls from Stallion Springs Lake. Said permittee shall pay a fee of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for said permit. CSD volunteers, along with CSD staff, may recover the golf balls from the lake, resell the balls and utilize the money for park operations. (Ord. 71, 4-19-1990; amd. FISHING PERMITS

6-2-1: **ELIGIBILITY FOR PERMITS:** Permits shall be issued to anyone with appropriate identification. Permits will be required by persons over the age of twelve (12) years. Children twelve (12) years of age or younger are not required to have a permit to fish, but must have adult supervision. If the supervising adult fishes, he is required to have a permit. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988; Ord. 105, 5-15-1997)

6-2-2: **APPLICATION FOR PERMIT:** An application for a permit shall be made to the district in writing on a form provided therefor. The permit shall constitute an agreement by the permittee to comply with all conditions imposed in granting of such permit. An application for a permit shall be obtainable at the office of the community services district or any other designated outlet during regular business hours. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988; Ord. 123, 12-18-2001)

6-2-3: **ISSUANCE OF PERMIT:** The general manager and staff and other designated individuals are authorized to issue fishing permits and shall keep a record of those issued. All permits shall be numbered and shall bear upon their face the name, mailing address and street address of the holder, as well as the expiration date. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988; Ord. 123, 12-18-2001)

6-2-4: **FEEs:** Each application shall be accompanied by a fee in the amount established by the board of directors of the Stallion Springs community services district.

The fees established may be revised from time to time by resolution pursuant to section 1-2-3 of this code. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988; Ord. 105, 5-15-1997; Ord. 123, 12-18-2001)

6-2-5: **PERMIT PERIOD:** Annual permits shall be issued by the district or other authorized outlets to expire one year from the date of issuance. Temporary permits shall be issued for two (2) consecutive calendar days only. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988; Ord. 105, 5-15-1997; Ord. 123, 12-18-2001)

6-2-6: **REVOCATION:** Any permit may be revoked by the district, or renewal thereof denied for any violation of the provisions of this chapter, or fraud or misrepresentation in the application for the permit. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988)

6-2-7: **NOTICE AND HEARING:** Any person whose permit is revoked or denied renewal may request a hearing before the board of directors to determine whether good cause exists for the revocation of the permit. Such hearing can be part of the agenda of one of the board's regular meetings. The affected permittee shall be given at least ten (10) days' prior notice of the hearing, which notice shall be given in writing by first class mail, with postage prepaid, addressed to the address of the permittee shown on such permit, setting out the date, time and place of the hearing. The affected permittee shall have the right to present evidence at the hearing. The board's decision following such a hearing shall be final. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. CHAPTER 3

ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT

6-3-1: **ENFORCEMENT:** The provisions of this title are to be enforced by the Stallion Springs police department. (Ord. 4, 6-17-1975; amd. Ord. 61, 12-19-1988)

6-3-2: **VIOLATIONS; PENALTIES:** Any person violating any provision of section 6-1-2 of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues. Violations are punishable as provided in section 1-2-4 of this code. The first offense is punishable by a two hundred fifty dollar (\$250.00) fine, the second offense is punishable by a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) fine, the third and each additional violation is punishable by a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).
