The District has always had this policy in place but as noted in the letter there is a need to pass the newly drafted Resolution in order to meet Government Code standards and meet the guidelines of the excess carrier for SDRMA.

WHEREAS,	Stallion Springs Community Services District utilizes the services of Governing Body Members and Volunteers; and
WHEREAS,	Section 336.5 of the California Labor Code provides that a person who performs voluntary service for a public agency as designated and authorized by the Governing Body of the agency or its designee, shall, upon adoption of a resolution by the Governing body of the agency so declaring, be deemed to be an employee of the agency for the purpose of Division 4 of said Labor Code while performing such services; and
WHEREAS,	the Governing Body wishes to extend Workers' Compensation coverage as provided by State law to the following designated categories of persons as indicated by a checkmark in the box to the left of the descriptions:

- All Members of the Governing Body of the Stallions Springs Community Services \mathbf{x} District as presently or hereafter constituted and/or
- All persons performing voluntary services without pay other than meals, X transportation, lodging or reimbursement for incidental expenses.
- Individuals on Work-study programs
- Interns
- X Other Volunteers

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that such persons coming within the categories specified above, including the duly elected or appointed replacements of any Governing Body Member and other designated individuals be deemed to be employees of the Stallion Springs Community Services District, for the purpose of Workers' Compensation coverage as provided in Division 4 of the Labor Code while performing such service. However, said Governing Body Members and other designated individuals will not be considered an employee of the Stallion Springs Community Services District for any purpose other than for such Workers' Compensation coverage, nor grant nor enlarge upon any other right, duty, or responsibility of such Governing Body Members or other designated individuals, nor allow such persons to claim any other benefits or rights given to paid employees of the Stallion Springs Community Services District.

Re: Workers' Compensation Resolution for Governing Body Member and/or Volunteer Coverage

Dear Mr. Aranda

Recently our excess carrier has made us aware that SDRMA Workers' Compensation (WC) members need to pass a **new Resolution** if they would like to <u>continue</u> (or start) covering their Governing Body members and/or volunteers.

Section 3363.5 of the California Labor Code provides that a person who performs voluntary service for a public agency as designated and authorized by the Governing Body of the agency or its designee, shall, upon adoption of a Resolution by the Governing Body of the agency so declaring, be deemed to be an employee for workers' compensation purposes. Thus, if such a resolution is adopted, and the volunteer is injured while performing duties for the agency, the volunteer is entitled to receive workers' compensation benefits and their exclusive remedy for recovery against the agency is through the Workers' Compensation system.

Such Governing Body members and/or volunteers may be covered for workers' compensation benefits only if a Resolution to that effect is adopted by the Governing Body pursuant to Labor Code § 3363.5 and a copy of the Resolution is filed with SDRMA.

A new Resolution (see attached) has been created by our coverage counsel. The Resolution permits your Governing Body to designate the various categories of persons who the agency desires to "deem" to be employees for purposes of workers' compensation. It declares, on a blanket basis, that the designated categories of volunteers are deemed employees and those categories consist of Governing Body Members, persons performing voluntary service, persons on work study, interns, and other volunteers. In addition, those so designated persons also need to be listed under our Workers' Compensation Program (which includes paying an annual contribution amount) to enable coverage.

When using the sample Resolution provided, please do <u>not</u> make any changes other than the areas highlighted in yellow. To ensure accurate and timely implementation of your Resolution, please return your Governing Body approved Workers' Compensation Resolution as soon as possible by fax or email. These currently include, but are not limited to, travel costs (mileage) at the IRS authorized rate; actual expenses for being away from our offices on District business; postage; legal research; and any cost of printing or reproducing documents, photographs, or other items necessary for legal representation.

Conclusion

In conclusion, we welcome the opportunity to discuss the legal needs of the District and would welcome the opportunity to meet with the District to determine how BB&K can best serve the District. We look forward to meeting with District representatives to further discuss our experience and qualifications.

- SSPD performed radar enforcement in the area of Banducci and Pellisier.
- Federal government inventory was completed of 1033 program rifles. All weapons are secure and accounted for.
- Loose dogs complaints continued on Jacks Hill Road. SSPD met with Animal Control and issued numerous additional citations to the animal owner. Animal Control spot checks the property each day and has impounded a number of dogs each week. SSPD has issued citations to the animal owner as well.
- SSPD officer responded to a medical emergency in Stallion Springs. Officers provided CPR to an adult male who was unconscious and not breathing. SSPD continued CPR until medical aid arrived. The adult male subject was pronounced deceased by medical aid.

 Officers inspected the fencing in the area and contacted the owner of the cattle who then repaired the fence and collected the cattle.

- SSPD investigated a dog bite incident in Stallion Springs. Animal control was called who responded to quarantine the dog at the location.
- SSPD stood by to keep the peace during a property pick-up which included firearms. The
 officer kept the peace during the domestic incident.

The General Manager's Report for November 15, 2017 through December 8, 2017.

- The hot patch machine has been at work patching the many pot holes in the district. The focus is on the large potholes initially.
- The curb and gutter that was washed out from last year's storms on St. Andrews
 has been reformed and a great amount of rock was backfilled to protect the area
 from future washouts.
- The district rented a dump truck and moved a good amount of rock not only to St. Andrews but also to areas on Mustang, and Tejon that were having severe erosion problems. The truck was also used to move dirt and level in the area around the wastewater plant.
- Staff spent time welding the wastewater plant in an effort to properly place the aerator in the clarifier. The area will also need to properly painted in order to prevent corrosion to the plant.
- The grant workers have been busy painting street signs (the old wooden ones)
 placing new street signs (the legally correct poles with green metal signs),
 cleaning roads, painting buildings and accomplishing other needs the District
 has.
- I have met with all employees and we are completing job descriptions and setting goals for 2018.
- Work has continued on the Personnel Manual. It should be brought to the Board for approval in January. I am meeting with the various employee groups to finalize some M.O.U.'s in regard to Uniforms. There has also been the need to clarify a few items.

- A meeting was held with the Road Engineer in preparation for a road contract and also in regard to addressing some ongoing issues that need to be addressed with some residents.
- We are working on obtaining quotes in order to properly maintain the swimming pool, having a properly working SCADA system and meet the requirements of the State in regard to the Wastewater Reports for Salinity that are long overdue.
- A meeting was held and a master calendar was developed with the various entities in Stallion, i.e. POA, PAL, CERT, CSU, etc.
- I met with Emma who is overseeing the library operations and the District is going to attempt to be a bit more helpful in regard to operational needs.
 IF YOU KNOW OF INDIVIDUALS WHO WOULD BE WILLING TO VOLUNTEERS IN ANY OF OUR ORGANIZATIONS PLEASE GET THE WORD OUT.
 - I am continuing to work on the solid waste issues with the county.
 - President Gordon, Chief Grant and I met with three Kern County Grand Jury Representatives. Chief gave them a tour of the office and police department and Gordon and myself answered some questions they had. Their visit was a routine one, for them to gain information about Stallion.
