IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

**1,2,3-Trichloropropane Monitoring Requirements
 Not Met for Stallion Springs Community Services District During 2nd Quarter 2018**

Our water system recently failed a drinking water standard during the 2nd Quarter 2018 and, therefore was in violation of the regulations. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct the situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During the 2nd quarter 2018, we did not collect 1,2,3-trichloropropane (1,2,3-TCP) samples(s) from the source(s) listed in the table below and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time. **However, this well was not being used for drinking water during this time frame.**

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant we did not properly test for during the calendar year 2018, how may samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples will be taken.

- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

A sample for 1,2,3-TCP was collected from Cumming Valley Well 01 on July 12, 2018 (3rd Quarter 2018) to ensure water produced by the well meet the 1,2,3-TCP standard. For more information, please contact David Aranda with Stallion Springs Community Services District at 661-300-1231.
